

# Georgian Trail Improvements Would Benefit Pedestrians, Runners and Cyclists



The Georgian Cycle and Ski Trail Association has made a proposal to the Georgian Trail Board of Management for additional maintenance and some upgrades to the Georgian Trail.

The Georgian Trail represents the major active transportation route linking Collingwood with Meaford, and Thornbury and importance is continually Both Simcoe increasing. Grey Counties have been actively promoting cycling tourism with the goal of making the South Georgian Bay area a destination of choice for cycling activities. To further develop the region's cycling tourism potential, a 1000-kilometre signature cycling route connecting communities around Georgian Bay, known as the Georgian Bay Cycle Route, is being planned and will utilize the Georgian Trail between Collingwood and Meaford as its route through the South Georgian Bay area.

The Association has requested that the Board of Management expend additional funds to increase the level of maintenance on the Georgian Trail sufficient to return it to its original design specifications. Some of the issues that should be addressed are:

- 1. *The width of the Trail*. There are several locations where the width has narrowed significantly from the original design width of 10-12 feet in some cases to a width of only 5 feet.
- 2. **Soft surface.** There are locations where the surface has become soft with loose gravel a hazardous situation for cyclists.
- 3. *Inadequate drainage*. There are locations where water puddles after a rainfall an annoyance to all users of the Trail.
- 4. *Routing.* The eastern entrance into Thornbury continues to be a challenge for cyclists because of the twisting and turning section through the trees east of Grey Street North.

The Association believes it is essential that the Georgian Trail surface be appropriately maintained so that road cyclists, trail cyclists, and mountain bikers of all ages and skill levels can feel totally comfortable and safe on the trail while still co-existing peacefully with pedestrians, runners, and dog walkers on this world class multi-use trail.

COMMUNITY LIVING 60 Meaford YEARS

In February, 1955, the Kent Women's Institute saw a need for a separate school system for the developmentally handicapped children of the community. The Women's Institute called a general meeting, inviting the other five institutes that existed in the area, as well as the various service clubs and organizations. The meeting was held in the old Legion building, which later housed the first school for developmentally handicapped children. This building was formerly the residence of the first teacher of the school, Mrs. Kay Butchart.

It started as the Meaford and District Association for Mentally Retarded, then became the Meaford-Beaver Valley Community Support Services and is now a member of the provincially recognized Community Living movement. From 1987 until 2010, the Association had a meeting place on Clarksburg's main street. This move was due to overcrowding and long waiting lists for the Kay Butchart Workshop. A program, combining the elements of both Developmental program and the Workshop, was initiated. The program also enabled the Association to serve a high needs client from this area. Community Living Meaford still serves the areas of Meaford and The Blue Mountains.

This is the 60th Anniversary year for Community Living Meaford. They will be hosting a celebration on Sunday, August 30 with a free barbecue corn roast for the community, with food, fun and family activities at the Meaford Harbour Pavilion. All are welcome.

Thornbury-Clarksburg Rotary Club will be hosting the 3rd annual Run Blue Mountains Sunday, October 18. The run includes a Half Marathon, 10K run, 5K run, and a 1K kids' fun run. In conjunction with the run, there will be a 5K and 10k walk to support animal rescue.

The Run is located in Ontario's largest apple region in celebration of which each winning runner receives an apple pie in addition to their medal! Each runner registered will receive a runner's toque, appropriate for the coming winter season, finishing medal and lunch.

The run starts and ends at the Beaver Valley Community Centre in Thornbury.
