



The Earth Film Festival is Back After a Two-Year Hiatus! Thursday May 19

The Grey Sauble Conservation Foundation is hosting their 5th annual Earth Film Festival at the Roxy Theatre in Owen Sound on Thursday, May 19, 2022. The theme for this year's festival highlights the beauty and incredible migration of the monarch butterfly and features the award-winning, Canadian production, "Flight of the Butterflies". This film is "a natural history epic. It's a compelling detective story. It's a scientific adventure at its best." With stunning visuals of hundreds of millions of monarchs, "Flight of the Butterflies" is a must-see movie.

Schools are invited to attend the matinee presentations at 10:00 am and 1:00 pm. The evening presentation is open to the public and starts with a social, displays, silent auction, and draw prizes at 6:00 pm with the film commencing at 7:00 pm.

An interactive butterfly presentation by Audrey Armstrong, an instructor with the Monarch Butterfly Network of Canada, will also be featured at each presentation. Audrey Armstrong is a knowledgeable researcher who has devoted many years to studying the migration and habitats of monarchs and has tagged hundreds of butterflies. Her presentation titled "Bruce Grey Monarchs" will be featured followed by the film.

All funds raised from this event will benefit local conservation projects and student education grants supported by the Grey Sauble Conservation Foundation.

The Blue Mountains council voted in favour of a comment-free Facebook page at its meeting on May 10. Council was presented with two options by town staff: allow comments for a trial basis of three months (with comments about the 2022 municipal election disabled), with staff monitoring/moderating during regular business hours or no comments allowed at all for three months. Town staff said they would report back to council after the three month period with more data.

Council chose to move forward with the Facebook page with no comments allowed and staff will report back to the new council in January 2023. A number of other municipalities and media sites have also disallowed comments.

Town Receives \$3.4 Million Grant for Watermain Replacement Project and Scores 100% on Annual Drinking Water System Inspection Report

The Town of The Blue Mountains is pleased to announce that the Town has received a \$3.4 million grant from the federal and provincial governments to support the replacement of substandard watermain. The funds were received through the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program's Green Infrastructure Funding Stream, and are designated for the continuation of the Town's Substandard Watermain Replacement Project.

The scope of the project and use of the grant funds will include the replacement of approximately 3,205 meters of watermain on Lakeshore Drive, Harbour Street, Alice Street, Peel Street South, Baring Street, Napier Street West, Woodland Park Road, and Ann Heggveit Drive, as well as the installation of fire hydrants and restoration of affected infrastructure.

"These are badly needed dollars that will greatly assist the Town in upgrading our infrastructure," stated Mayor Alar Soever. I want to thank the federal and provincial governments for their funding, and I especially want to congratulate staff on their successful funding application."

The news of the funding comes after the Town received a 100% compliance rating on the annual inspection of the Thornbury Drinking Water System administered by the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks. The Ministry's rigorous and comprehensive inspection program evaluates the drinking water system source, capacity, treatment processes, operations manuals, logbooks, certification and training, water quality monitoring, and reporting and corrective actions.

"On behalf of the community, I would like to thank our water team for the outstanding care, commitment, and hard work that has made this 100% result possible and a reality," said Chief Administrative Officer, Shawn Everitt.

The Inspection Report Rating provides a quantitative summary of the drinking water system's annual inspection and is published in the Ministry's Chief Drinking Water Inspector's Annual Report.

"As of March, ten out of 36 real estate markets in Ontario had an average home price over a million dollars, and six others are on the verge of breaking the million-dollar mark. High-prices are driving young families right out of the province to find a home they can afford," said OREA CEO Tim Hudak. "Ontario stands to lose its edge as one of the most attractive places to raise a family or start a business because of the runaway cost of housing. For a political party to win in June, they need to show voters they have the solutions for Ontario's housing affordability crisis."

OREA wants to encourage governments to review the steps needed for property conversions from commercial to mixed-residential to eliminate barriers and fast-track these processes.

Make Home Ownership More Affordable - Green Ontario Homes

Home energy audits are a long-term tool that will allow homeowners to take the first step in figuring out what retrofits their home requires to operate at peak efficiency. Not only do home energy audits make homes more energy efficient and contribute to the province's collective GHG reduction targets, but audits can stand to save Ontarian's money on their hydro bills. To establish a coordinated effort across levels of government in home energy efficiency and climate mitigation, it is recommended that the Government of Ontario implement a voluntary Home Energy Audit program and provide incentives to encourage consumers to purchase green home retrofits.

Limited housing supply, pandemic-related factors, and changing demographics have resulted in skyrocketing housing prices across the province. Ontario home prices have tripled in the last ten years, but average household incomes have increased only 30 per cent. According to a recent affordability report from the National Bank of Canada, it would take 26.5 years – or 318 months – for a Toronto resident (making \$195,000) to save a down payment on an average priced home in the city.

The 43rd Ontario General Election

The election will be held on **Thursday, June 2, 2022.**

As of December 2016, Ontario elections are held on the first Thursday in June in the fourth calendar year following the previous general election.

Register to vote for Ontario's June 2022 election

Voters are being encouraged to confirm, update, or add their information to the provincial voters list ahead of the upcoming general election.

Canadian citizens residing in Ontario who will be at least 18 years old on election day can use [eRegistration](https://eregistration.elections.on.ca/en/home) to add themselves to the voters list, or to quickly and easily confirm that their information is up to date.

To update or add your information, you will need one piece of identification that has your name and current residential address. Once the election has been called, those on the list will receive a voter information card, with personalized information about when and where to vote. <https://eregistration.elections.on.ca/en/home>

- If you're temporarily living outside of Ontario, you may be eligible to register as an absentee voter.
- Voters who aren't yet on the voters list can register in person when they go to vote.
- Canadian citizens who are 16 or 17 years old and live in Ontario can prepare to vote in future elections by adding themselves to the Ontario Register of Future Voters. Once they turn 18, they will automatically be included on the voters list. www.elections.on.ca



2022-2026 Strategic Plan Approved

The Blue Mountains Public Library Board approved the Strategic Plan 2022-2026 at the April Board Meeting. This document will be on the website in early May and will be followed by a mailed Executive Report. Additional copies will be available at both the L.E. Shore and Craigleith Heritage Depot locations. This document will replace the 2018-2022 plan, and was developed after a 14-month Strategic Plan Study.

The Board wishes to thank the community for participating in this Study. Over the three active phases we held 283 community conversations, heard from 68 residents at focus

groups, received 368 Micro-Surveys, 207 wrap-up feedback surveys, and 2,576 comments through our post-it note activity.

The new Plan includes the 3 Pillars of Community Hubs, Empowering Service, and Organizational Excellence. These pillars have 11 goals and will be operationalized at the May Board Meeting through the 2022 Action Plan. Additionally, the Plan has 2 underpinning themes which are a lens which of Truth & Reconciliation, and Equity, Diversity & Inclusion (EDI). 




